2020/2021:-

- Articulate five year plan for implementation of Balanced System[®] approach to support for ALC & SLCN across Kent
- Updated needs assessment (0-25) including stakeholder engagement and specific project around 16-25 age group
- Work with providers and stakeholders to build the vision of the offer whilst appreciating the existing pressures and seeking 'quick wins' towards the long term ambitions
- Support for local leaders in planning for the delivery of the long term offer
- Build on the Balanced System Schools & Settings (S4SS)
 work already established by training local Licensed Mentors;
 offering 10 Centre of Excellence and for up to 40 schools to
 either continue beyond accreditation or new joiners

2021/2022 :-

- April 2021 introduce new model to partners in with a view to shadow form from January 2022 and full implementation by end of academic year
- Co-produce 16-25 element of the pathway and implement
- Summer 2022 Balanced System® Schools and Settings celebration, sharing event
- Ongoing recruitment of schools & settings
- LM active in supporting schools & setting
- Establishing baselines for impact monitoring and impact measures

2022/2025 : -

Ongoing support for commissioners and providers including impact measurement; adapting service model to emerging factors; ongoing support and development of schools & settings through S4SS

Priorities:

- Establish local lead and local contacts for engagement and needs assessment
- 2. Scope vision with providers and identify quick wins
- 3. Recruit schools for C of Excellence
- 4. Train Licensed Mentors
